# **Directions To Your Cottage**

Arrival Time – Please remember access to the property is from 4.00 pm. If you arrive a little early, you are welcome to park at the property and stretch your legs around Port Eynon.

Guests with satnav or google maps please enter Ivy Cottage, Port Eynon, SA3 1NN to find the location. Please note there is no street name.

#### Or alternatively -

Leave the M4 at J42 and proceed along the dual carriageway (A483) into Swansea, past the SA1 development, Sainsburys on the left, through several sets of lights, past the leisure centre (LC2) and the County Hall on the left, follow the dual carriageway road with Swansea Bay immediately on your left. The road becomes Oystermouth road and then Mules road (A4607) and you are heading towards Mumbles. Past the university and Singleton Hospital on your right, playing fields on your right. Then with Blackpill lido on the left and the Woodman pub on the right, take the right filter at the traffic lights and turn right up Mayals Road. Continue up the tree lined hill, across Clyne Common at the top, past the villages of Murton and Bishopston and through Kittle. Approximately ½ mile after Kittle turn right (Pennard Church in front of you), along Vennaway Lane which comes to a T junction after half a mile. Turn left onto the A4118 South Gower Road and proceed through Parkmill, Penmaen, Nicholaston, Perriswood, Knelston and Scurlage to the end of the A4118 terminating in Port Eynon.

Once you have descended into the village just past the Church the road bears to the right. After 100 yards take the turning to the left (signposted Borfa House) and Ivy Cottages are located 100 yards on the right opposite the Ship Inn, set back 40 yards from the road.

### Off Road Parking for Both Properties

If using Oxwich View Cottage, there is space for two cars. Please park parallel to the fence line on the left.

For Port Eynon Beach Cottage, there is space for 2 cars along the wall to the right.

# **Accessibility Statement**

Oxwich View is our cottage on the left, Port Eynon Beach is our cottage to the right, when used together they are known as Ivy Cottage.

Arrival Time – Please remember access to the property is from 4.00pm.

**Oxwich View Cottage** is approached via a gravel driveway and is the cottage to the left-hand side. Parking is provided for two cars and the cars should be drawn up to the end of the lawn parallel to the fence.

Keys to the property can be found in a lockbox beside the front door. Codes will be given prior to your stay. Access is gained through the door of the UPVC porch over the flat flag stone patio. The entrance is sufficiently low to allow wheelchair access. There is a small step (30mm) up into the kitchen and also into the cloakroom toilet. The kitchen leads through to the living area on a level floor.

Stairs in the corner of the kitchen lead to the first-floor bedrooms (one with ensuite) and family bathroom. This cottage is not suitable for guests who have difficulty in climbing stairs.

Access to the private patio and the garden/ barbecue area are either via the side gate from the parking area or one of the two pairs of patio doors from the kitchen and living area.

**Port Eynon Beach Cottage** is approached via a gravel driveway and is the cottage to the right-hand side. Parking is provided for two cars and the cars should be drawn up and parked parallel to the wall on the right-hand side.

Keys to the property can be found in a lockbox beside the front door. Codes will be given prior to your stay. Access is gained through the main front door. The entrance is sufficiently low to allow wheelchair access. Once through the dining area and kitchen area, there is a small step up into the lounge.

Stairs in the corner of the lounge lead to the first-floor bedrooms (one with ensuite) and family bathroom. Located downstairs (next to the dining area) is one double bedroom with ensuite.

There is a small patio area with table and chairs that can be accessed via the lounge area and access to the garden/barbecue area is via a gate from the driveway. Port Eynon Beach Cottage garden is the one on the left.

From this cottage you have permission to use the gate that can be found through the French doors within the lounge area. This will provide you with a more direct route to the beach.

Please ensure when entering the property, the main gate remains closed for your privacy and the safety of other guests. Please use the gate stop provided if you need to leave the gate open at any time to prevent the gate from swinging into the road.

## Inventory

### To enable you to plan for your trip; here is a summary of what you will find in either one of our cottages.

Basic Kitchen consumables: - including salt, pepper, oil, tin foil, clingfilm, kitchen roll & tea towels. Bags/liners for the kitchen bins.

Basic Bathroom consumables: - including toilet paper and handwash.

Cleaning products including dishwasher tablets: - please note powder or pods are NOT provided for the washing machine.

Fully equipped kitchens: including fridge/freezer, hob/oven, microwave, toaster, slow cooker, kettle, washer dryer and dishwasher.

Nespresso By Krups Essenza Mini Coffee Machines.

Iron & Ironing board; clothes dryers and pegs.

Coat hangers.

Towels & linen: - beach towels are not included.

TV situated in the living room and WIFI throughout.

Cot, highchair and stairgates can be provided.

Children's plastic tableware available.

Wood burners: - First basket of fire wood and fire starters/matches are provided. Additional wood can be purchased at Knelston Garage or directly from SA Firewood Suppliers who can deliver to the cottage (Tel: Steven on 07946301890). Please note the cost of this additional wood is paid for by the guest upon delivery.

BBQ Area: We do not supply BBQ's. There is however an area where disposable BBQ's can be used within the gardens. If you would like to BBQ, please bring your own disposable ones with you.

Ice: Many of our guests ask where they can purchase ice. Knelston Garage (you pass on your way to Port Eynon) stocks ice (5 mins drive) as do most of the local campsite shops (within walking distance).

### Need to know - Part 1

### Please note the information in the section on local amenities in relation to food stores and eating options.

#### Heating

Heating and hot water is supplied from an Air Source Heat Pump. Hot water is supplied on demand and heating controls are pre-set and fixed.

You can control the heat in individual rooms by using the radiator thermostats. If the temperature is not warm enough, you can increase this by increasing the setting on the controller (located in the dining area in Port Eynon Beach Cottage and the upstairs landing in Oxwich View Cottage). By pressing the on button, you will see the current temperature of the room. By using the LED arrows, you can change the temperature as required. This will increase the temperature for the current period only, which will revert to the pre-set levels for the next timed period. If the temperature is too high press the down button to lower the setting.

The hot water will automatically continue to be supplied on demand even when the heating is switched off.

Towel radiators are located in each bathroom.

The wood burner is an efficient form of heating. A first basket of wood, kindling, fire starters and matches are available. To light the wood burner, open the vents, loosely scrunch some paper and place in the back of the burner, together with kindling. Light, and as soon as the kindling has caught place some smaller logs on the fire. Once established close the air vents to push the heat into the room space.

Please remember that the body of the wood burner gets extremely hot once the fire is established and small children must be kept away at all times.

#### **Electrical Supply**

The electrical circuits have been installed and tested (last test Nov 21) to the latest regulations. The fuse board is located above the door in the kitchen in Oxwich View Cottage and under the window in the dining room of Port Eynon Beach Cottage.

The circuits are marked up by the fuse board.

If a single fuse or RCD trips, try resetting it by flicking it on. If it trips again identify the cause by unplugging any appliances recently plugged in. If the fuse will still not reset, please contact us.

If the trip goes during hours of darkness, there is emergency lighting on the landing and in the kitchen (these can be used as hand held torches). In addition a torch can be found in the drawers next to the sink in the kitchen.

### Need to know - Part 2

#### **Refuse and Recycling**

You will find in your kitchen the following bins.

- 1. Small food bin in the cupboard under the sink for food waste only.
- 2. Five black bins marked up as (1) plastics (2) cardboard (3) tins (4) glass (5) general waste.
  - 1) Food waste can be collected in the green bin under the sink where you will also find liners for the bin. Once full these can be tied and transferred to the larger green food waste bin at the end of the drive.
  - 2) General waste (excluding food and recycled items). Black bin liners can be found under the sink. Once full these can be tied and transferred to the large black bin at the end of the driveway.
  - 3) Recycling Please find more details on what can be recycled on the following pages.
    - a. Clean plastic (as detailed in the following pages) can be placed directly into the bin in the kitchen. Once full this can be transferred to the pink plastic sack located at the end of the driveway.
    - b. Cardboard can be placed FLAT in the bin in the kitchen marked for cardboard. Once full the flat cardboard can be placed in the green bin at the end of the driveway.
    - c. Clean glass/tin (see details in the following pages). Place clean glass/tin items into the correctly marked bins in the kitchen. Once full these can be transferred into the green bins at the end of the driveway.

PLEASE DO NOT PLACE any items incorrectly into the outside bins as they will not be emptied.

PLEASE do not leave large broken items such as beach chairs, rucksacks etc. PLEASE take these items home with you.

PLEASE do not be tempted to throw non bagged items into the black bin when leaving the property or emptying the car. Please ensure all waste is bagged in the correct manner before placing into the bins.

We have a designated collection for all rubbish. **THERE IS NO ACTION TO BE TAKEN BY GUESTS**. The bins will be emptied and placed back at the end of the driveway.

Collected dog waste should not be put out in the bins but must be disposed of in the special local authority bins located around the village.

## Need to know - Part 4

#### **Barbecue**

The barbecue area is available for guests, guests are advised to provide their own disposable barbecue.

Please place the barbecue on the bricks provided to avoid cracking the slate.

Please dispose of spent barbecues, after allowing to cool, in a black bin liner, tie and place in the bin at the end of the driveway. **Please tidy up the area after use.** 

#### **Appliance Manuals**

The information you require is almost always online at the manufacturer's web site.

"Appliances Online" also have very good information on their web site at ao.com, including "how to use" videos

Please note the washing machines have a 2 minute safety interlock after the cycle is completed. If you try to force the door open before the interlock releases you will break the door handle.

#### WIFI

WIFI is provided free of charge to guests. Passwords required can be found in the cottages located by the TV.

Please be aware that improper or illegal use of this facility is strictly prohibited.

#### TV

The TV in Oxwich View Cottage is freeview only.

The TV in Port Eynon Beach Cottage is a smart TV.

### Pets

#### **Pets**

Pets are welcome by arrangement. Please observe the following.

- Please keep pets off furniture and beds.
- Please keep pets downstairs. Use the stair gate provided.
- If there is an accident or your pet causes any damage, please let us know before you leave.
- Please make sure you pick up all waste from the driveway or garden in a plastic bag and dispose of in one of the dog waste bins placed around the village. There are poo bags available in the cupboard under the sink if required.
- Please do not wash your pets in the bathrooms, there are outdoor taps at both cottages for this purpose.
- Please do not use the guest towels for your pets, there is a small basket of towels for pet use only.
- There is normally a supplement per week or part week for each pet to cover extra cleaning costs.
- Each property has its own gated garden for your convenience. Please be mindful of other guests and keep your pet's noise to a minimum.
- The Ship Inn and The Smugglers are both dog friendly.
- You are situated perfectly for long walks along the coastal paths or along Port Eynon Beach. Dogs are welcome on the beach from the 1st October until the 30th April. During the summer months dogs are welcome at the far side of the beach (Horton) which can be accessed using the dunes at the back of the beach or as you access the beach from Port Eynon, dogs are welcome to the right of the Lifeguards hut. Long walks can also be taken across the dunes, behind the beach. If unsure please see the website https://www.swansea.gov.uk/dogsonbeaches
- Please note during spring and sumer, Adders are common (but rarely seen) in the long grass surrounding the dunes, please be mindful when walking with small children or pets.

# Safety Information – Part 1

#### Please Note -

There is a **torch and basic medical kit** under the sink in each cottage. There is additional emergency lighting on the landing and in the kitchen, these can also be removed and used as torches.

**Fire blankets** can also be found under the sinks in each cottage – please notify us if these are used in the event of a small fire.

The **stopcock** for both cottages is located at the top of the driveway, when leaving the cottage it is just roadside of the gate to the left near the gate column. You may have to move some small stones to locate it.

**Fuse boards** can be found above the kitchen door in Oxwich View Cottage and in the dining area of Port Eynon Beach Cottage.

#### Fire Escape Routes and Evacuation Plan

The cottages are equipped with hard wired fire and smoke alarms. In the event that one or both are activated or a fire is discovered evacuate the building immediately and notify us. Do not stop to gather any belongings. Assemble in the drive way well away from the buildings and any danger from the fire.

The primary evacuation route is via the main entrance door, but where this is not accessible, use the patio windows from the kitchen or living area.

The balcony window in Oxwich View in the master bedroom on the first floor can also be used, but be aware there is a 10-foot drop onto the path/lawn below.

There are fire blankets in the kitchen area, but this is only suitable for small scale fires and in general the first priority must be evacuation of all persons.

Please note that these are Non-smoking properties. This includes E-Cigarettes/Vapes.

The use of candles (any kind) is also prohibited.

Please note our what3words for the location of the cottage. These are HANGS.PINGING.ESCAPING. These will help the emergency services find your location and can be found on the Fire Action Notice located at the front and rear entrances of the cottage.

#### Children and Safety

- Please mind the steps.
- Some upstairs windows open fully.
- Cot, highchair and stair gate can be provided.
- The wood burner gets very hot.
- There may be guests with cars next door.
- The cords on blinds can be a hazard for toddlers.

# Safety Information – Part 2

- Please close the main gate when exiting the property.
- Orange/EE is the only mobile network with reception in Port Eynon.

In an emergency if you do not have a mobile signal. Use the phones in The Ship, Smugglers Haunt or the public phone on the roundabout. If in doubt please ask. 0794 3780251.

#### Insurance

We carry full Public Liability insurance to protect our guests and a copy of the policy is available if required. However, we do not cover guest's personal property and effects of theft, loss, or damage in whatever form and however caused.

You should check your own household policy to ensure you are covered for personal possessions away from the home, and if you are not then you need to take out a holiday/travel policy as you would if you were going abroad.

We sincerely hope that the need to make a claim does not arise, but we do advise you to ensure that you have the appropriate insurance cover during your stay with us.

#### **Breakages & Accidents**

Please report breakages, accidental damage to furniture and kitchen equipment, spillages on carpets and spillages or accidental soiling of bed linen and mattresses.

You are unlikely to be charged, but we do need to know so we can repair, replace and renew for future guests.

Please notify us before your departure morning.

Honesty is the best policy and we will appreciate it.

## Important Contacts – Part 1

#### IN CASE OF EMERGENCY

If you have a real emergency use the emergency services **DIAL 999** but let us know as well, perhaps we can help.

Mountain Rescue Tel: Dial 999 or 112, then ask for 'Police' then 'Mountain Rescue'.

#### Make a note of all relevant details:

- Location (with a grid reference if possible)
- Name, gender and age of casualty
- Nature of injuries or emergency
- Number of people in the party
- Your mobile phone number

Give all your prepared details of the incident and STAY WHERE YOU ARE until contacted by the rescue team. If you have to make a further 999 call, follow this procedure in full again.

If you have hearing or speech difficulties, you can contact the 999 emergency services by text. You will only be able to use this service if you are registered with emergency SMS first, so register now — don't wait for an emergency! Text 'register' to 999 then follow the instructions sent. In an emergency, contact the emergency SMS service by texting 999. Your message should include 'Police' + details of incident + location.

#### Coastguard Tel: Dial 999 or 112, then ask for 'Police' then 'Coastguard'.

If you have hearing or speech difficulties, you can contact the 999 emergency services by text. You will only be able to use this service if you are registered with emergency SMS first, so register now — don't wait for an emergency! Text 'register' to 999 then follow the instructions sent. In an emergency, contact the emergency SMS service by texting 999. Your message should include 'Police' + details of incident + location.

#### **RNLI Lifeguards**

Present on the beach from the beginning of April through to the end of August.

So please ring in advance and check whether you should visit Scurlage or Pennard.

### Local Amenities – Part 1

#### Location:

The Cottages are situated just 150m from the beach and walking distance to all the local amenities including pub, restaurant, takeaways to suit all the family, a coffee shop, surf shop and general stores for provisions.

Port Eynon is the most southerly point of the Gower peninsula and surrounded by stunning coast and countryside vistas - there is nothing like the view over the village with the sea stretching to the horizon as you begin your descent down into Port Eynon via the winding lane. The former fishing village is a popular beach resort and although there is no port as the name suggests, it was once dominated by oyster fishing and the remains of the oyster pools and old harbour can be seen at low tide. The Blue Flag beach is backed by magnificent sand dunes to stretch your legs. Walking to the west, the Salt House ruins at the headland are a favourite walking destination and were once used by smugglers, whilst to the east you will find Horton or for those with more energy the beach provides direct access to the coastal path.

#### Food supplies:

In Port Eynon there are local shops on the camp sites (Highfield Caravan Park has a well-stocked shop) and mini markets at Scurlage and Knelston garage, both of which have a wide variety of produce including fresh bread, milk and newspapers. Tesco and Sainsbury deliver to the area and you are advised to take advantage of this facility. Use the post code SA3 1NN and the landmark "opposite the Ship Inn". The sign at the entrance is Ivy Cottage. Please remember to add the name of your cottage in the additional information: Port Eynon Beach Cottage (right) or Oxwich View Cottage (left).

During the summer months there are often local produce markets held at the Gower Heritage Centre, The Gower Market held in Three Crosses and there's also a farmers market in Mumbles - but please check their website or Facebook pages for further details. Some of the farms you pass through also have vegetables or fruit picking options during the summer months.

Another favourite for guests who like to barbecue or just really like a good bacon sandwich! Gower Coast Meat – Butchers in LLanmorlais.

### Local Amenities – Part 2

#### **Eating Options:**

The Ship Inn is our local pub where you can enjoy food and drink and not have to worry about driving home! The pub is both child and dog friendly.

There are also two fish and chip shops on the sea front. The Captains Table and the Seafarer, offering food, cold drinks and breakfast options. The Smugglers Beach Bar & Kitchen has a great outdoor space for catching those last sun rays and food and alcoholic drinks are available.

The Beach House Surf & Coffee shop has a wide variety of coffees, teas and delicious cakes and sandwiches if you are looking for a little something between meals.

Ships Ahoy Fish & Chip Shop, Scurlage (Easter/Summer open times). Three Cliffs Campsite (a short car journey) has two vendors that visit during the peak holiday months which are also great alternatives. Food Anarchy and The Gower Dough co. Please check their Facebook pages.

And let's not forget ice cream! Try one of the many ice cream flavours down the front or buy a tub of Joe's or Gower Gelato – made right here in Wales.

Further afield there are more restaurants and pubs in The Gower – please check our website.






